MANDATORY ANNUAL LEADER TRAINING...SAVE THE DATE!

Annual Leader Training will be held on September 19 at the Oscar Johnson 4-H Center from 5-7 p.m. This training will be held prior to the Adult Leaders Association

monthly meeting. This year's annual training will be on ACEs (Adverse Childhood Experiences).

Each chartered group in Wisconsin is required to have at least one leader attend for their Annual Charter Renewal requirements.

YOUTH TRACTOR SAFETY TRAINING

A tractor and machinery certification program is being offered on Tuesday, June 20, Wednesday, June 21, and Friday, June 23 at the Spooner Ag Research Station. This 24-hour program meets the requirements of Wisconsin Act 455, which requires youth under the age of 16 to hold a certificate of training in order to operate a tractor or self-propelled implement of husbandry for their parents or guardians on a public road. It also meets the child labor requirements

in agriculture under the Fair Labor Standards Act, pertaining to the employment of youth ages 14-15 on farms not operated by their parents or guardians.

The course instructors include UW-Extension and Spooner Agriculture Research Station staff, High School Agriculture instructors from Spooner and Shell Lake, and other invited guests. The hours of the course will be from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Students must be at least 12 years old to enroll in the

program and attendance at all three days' training is required for certification.

Interested youth must pre-register by contacting the UW-Extension Spooner Agriculture Agents Office at 715-635-3506 or 1-800-528-1914, and provide their name, age, address, telephone number and social security number. A signed waiver form by the youth's parent or legal guardian is also required to participate in the training. Cost of the course is \$20.

- \$50 registration fee (Saturday - lunch only)

Lodging:

- \$45/night if two adults
- \$75 - Single adult room
- \$25/night with three or more adults per room
- \$25/night with three-four youth per room

Note: The room cost increases if there is more than one person. This is why the room rates are not half of the single room rate.

All youth participants need to have a chaperone who has completed Youth Protection identified when they register.

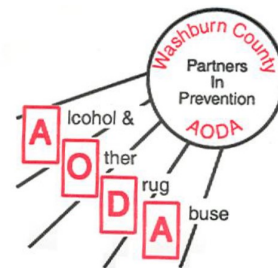
